Listening Sessions: Equitable Building Decarbonization

The Building Energy, Equity & Power (BEEP) Coalition is hosting a series of listening sessions to hear from renters, homeowners, contractors, developers, and community members about opportunities and challenges with equitable building decarbonization via whole-home retrofits.

In-person and/or virtual sessions will be held in the San Joaquin Valley, San Francisco Bay Area, and Los Angeles. There will also be a "statewide" virtual session that everyone is welcome to join.

Representatives from the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC), Energy Commission, and Air Resources Board will attend each session. They will provide background information about their agencies and listen to and learn from attendees.
